**Background**

On July 23rd, 2019, the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW) issued a final order approving a Simplified Rate Case for the Milwaukee Water Works (MWW). A Simplified Rate Case (SRC) will result in an increase in the MWW rates of 3%. The Mequon Water Utility (Utility) has had the ability to pass this rate increase through to its customers utilizing the Purchased Water Adjustment Clause (PWAC) in the past. The PSCW authorized MWW to begin using the new rates as of September 1st, 2019.

**Analysis**

In September of 2017, MWW implemented a Simplified rate case and the Mequon Water Utility utilized the PWAC to pass along those additional costs. At this time, Utility staff is proposing that the Utility utilize the PWAC again, as MWW continues to work on a full rate case with the PSCW. If the Utility does not implement the PWAC for this increase, the Utility cannot use this tool in the future. The Utility has 90 days to implement a PWAC after an increase from the Utility’s suppliers. Alternatively, the Utility would be required to request a full rate case in the future, which requires significantly higher fees to the PSCW and significantly more time by Utility staff to prepare the financial documents for the full rate case.

**Fiscal Impact**

In the absence of a PWAC, the expenses incurred by the Utility would increase disproportionately to the revenue received. The Utility is restricted by the inability to qualify for a simplified rate case based on the Utility’s current healthy financial performance with a 10.64% rate of return.

The PSCW has not approved a Utility Purchased Water Adjustment yet, however as an example; in 2017 (the last SRC implemented for MWW) based on the water supply cost increases from MWW, the typical Mequon Water Utility customer (5/8 inch meter, 18,500 gallons per quarter) received the following impact on their quarterly water bill:

Average Customer impact on quarterly water bill: *\$0.94 per quarter increase*

**Recommendation**

Staff recommends that the Water Utility Commission authorize the Mequon Water Utility to implement the Purchased Water Adjustment Clause to increase our rates due to the Simplified Rate Case final order issued for the Milwaukee Water Works this July.

**FINAL DECISION**

**Introduction**

On July 2, 2019, the Milwaukee Water Works (Utility) filed an application for a water rate increase under Wis. Stat. § 196.193, a Simplified Rate Case (SRC) process that does not require a hearing. Commission staff reviewed the information submitted by the Utility in support of its application and determined the water rate increase is justified as requested.

**Findings of Fact**

1. The revenue increase is calculated by multiplying the Utility's prior year revenue from sales of utility service by the 2019 rate increase factor (3.0 percent) set by the Commission.
2. The revenue increase combined with the Utility's prior year net operating income results in an overall rate of return that does not exceed 5.7 percent, the Commission's 2019 established overall rate of return applicable to a municipally owned water or combined water and sewer public utility.
3. The effective date of the rate increase is not less than 12 months from the effective date of a previous SRC increase and is not less than 45 days from the date of this application.
4. The Utility's last rate increase authorized pursuant to a hearing under Wis. Stat. § 196.20 has been in effect for at least a calendar year (i.e., January through December).
5. The Utility has 4,000 or more customers and the effective date of the rate increase is not more than 5 years from the effective date of an increase authorized pursuant to a hearing under Wis. Stat. § 196.20.

6. The Utility notified all its customers of the proposed rate increase.

### **Conclusion of Law**

1. The Commission has jurisdiction under Wis. Stat. §§ 196.02, 196.193 and 196.39, and Wis. Admin. Code ch. PSC 185.

2. The Commission has authority under Wis. Stat. § 15.02(4) to delegate to the Administrator of the Division of Water Utility Regulation and Analysis, those functions vested by law as enumerated above.

### **Order**

1. The Utility shall increase its rates for general service, public fire protection, and wholesale service uniformly by the 3.0 percent rate increase factor.

2. The new rates will be effective September 1, 2019, and will be on file with the Commission as Amendment 116, provided that the Utility makes a copy of the new rates available to the public before this date by placing a copy of the new rates at locations where customer payments are accepted, on the Utility's website, or in a form and place that is otherwise readily accessible to the public. If a copy of the new rates is not made available to the public by this date, the new rates shall take effect on the date they are so made available.

3. The Utility shall inform each customer of the new rates authorized by this order.

4. The Utility's current rates and rules shall be available for public inspection.

5. The Utility shall keep on permanent file all its previous rates.

6. Jurisdiction is retained.

7. This order is effective one day after the date of service.

**NOTICE OF RIGHTS FOR REHEARING OR JUDICIAL REVIEW, THE  
 TIMES ALLOWED FOR EACH, AND THE IDENTIFICATION OF THE  
 PARTY TO BE NAMED AS RESPONDENT**

The following notice is served on you as part of the Commission's written decision. This general notice is for the purpose of ensuring compliance with Wis. Stat. § 227.48(2), and does not constitute a conclusion or admission that any particular party or person is necessarily aggrieved or that any particular decision or order is final or judicially reviewable.

*PETITION FOR REHEARING*

If this decision is an order following a contested case proceeding as defined in Wis. Stat. § 227.01(3), a person aggrieved by the decision has a right to petition the Commission for rehearing within 20 days of the date of service of this decision, as provided in Wis. Stat. § 227.49. The date of service is shown on the first page. If there is no date on the first page, the date of service is shown immediately above the signature line. The petition for rehearing must be filed with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin and served on the parties. An appeal of this decision may also be taken directly to circuit court through the filing of a petition for judicial review. It is not necessary to first petition for rehearing.

*PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW*

A person aggrieved by this decision has a right to petition for judicial review as provided in Wis. Stat. § 227.53. In a contested case, the petition must be filed in circuit court and served upon the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin within 30 days of the date of service of this decision if there has been no petition for rehearing. If a timely petition for rehearing has been filed, the petition for judicial review must be filed within 30 days of the date of service of the order finally disposing of the petition for rehearing, or within 30 days after the final disposition of the petition for rehearing by operation of law pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.49(5), whichever is sooner. If an *untimely* petition for rehearing is filed, the 30-day period to petition for judicial review commences the date the Commission serves its original decision.<sup>1</sup> The Public Service Commission of Wisconsin must be named as respondent in the petition for judicial review.

If this decision is an order denying rehearing, a person aggrieved who wishes to appeal must seek judicial review rather than rehearing. A second petition for rehearing is not permitted.
